WeDevar (Numbers) 5:18 And the kohen (priest) shall set the woman before YHWH, and uncover/loosen the woman's hair, and put the offering of memorial in her hands, which is the jealousy offering: and the kohen (priest) shall have in his hand the bitter mayim that causes the curse:

As a test the High Priest loosened the woman's hair as it was common custom in the ancient days for married women to have some type of covering and braided hair. The Hebrew word Para means to loosen her hair somewhat literally so her hair is fully exposed.

In the home a Father/Husband/Brother has authority over the woman as a steward guardian so unless they force you a woman who is single never has to wear a head covering inside or outside the house. Even a married woman is at the liberty of her husband who can decide for her but she too does not need to wear a headcovering.

The only time that all the congregation both male and female covered their heads was when they worshipped YHWH.

In ancient Israel a covered woman was by necessity so that they do not get abducted by gentiles or be raped by them hence by some women covered their heads so that they are seen by gentiles as having a husband.

The Torah has never at any point made a commandment to women to cover their heads. Many things we did were simply cultural.

We are not Muslims to be walking around like Ninjas so ladies beware, you don't want to be picked on by office staff or outside people and persecuted. Don't do something that will bring unnecessary hardship to you.

The only time you should be covering your heads is when you pray and at all other times you do not need to unless you do it because its something your family has always done as a tradition.

Protect yourself and your loved ones, God is not a sadomasochist who is looking to punish people because of ignorant men and their foolish ideas.

If a head covering is going to bring problems in the office you should not be wearing it and the same goes for when you go out. No brown points are achieved by doing something YHWH did not command!!!
